Terms—As we are not collecting to order, but have collected and established a good supply of all the above (except where otherwise noted), and can therefore *promptly fill orders from slock*, our terms are strictly *Cash with order* for all kinds listed as being in stock. Where plants "expected" are ordered, payment will be due on shipment of the goods. Where cash is not sent with the order we shall make sight draft with bill of lading attached.

Having collectors constantly in the field in California and Arizona, as well as in Mexico and the islands, we shall often have a supply of many species not listed; and we beg our customers to write to us always for any kinds native of these parts, of which they may be in want.

Our object will be to supply at the lowest cost consistent with a *reliable supply of good plants*, all the cacti and succulents obtainable in the above districts, and to give special attention to correct nomenclature, to prevent disappointment.

We issue, also, a list of California Bulbs, etc., and invite *correspondence* in regard to any of our native or Mexican plants or seeds.

Novelties and Rarities.

- Cereus chloranthus, var. cæspitosus-A few fine colored specimens; 75c to \$1.50 each.
- Cereus Cochal, Orcutt—Bright green, tree like, with stout black spines, flowers greenish white; \$60.00 per 100.
- Cereus Engelmanni, and varieties-Fine clusters, 3-6 heads, large: \$1.00 to 2.50 each.
- Cereus gummosus, Engelm-A large species with broad black spines, plants 25-35 cm. high; \$100.00 per 100.
- Cereus maritimus, M. E. Jones—A little known, low-growing, cæspitose species; \$75.00 per 100.
- Cereus mojaveusis, Engelm-A cæspitose kind, of great symmetry, hundreds of heads growing sometimes into one great hemisphere, covered with blood-red blossoms.

- Cereus Pringlei, Watson-The "Giant" of Lower California, grow-ing sometimes fifty feet high. Plants from 25 to 60 cm. high; \$200.00 per 100.
- Echinocactus Emoryi, var. chrysacanthus-A beautiful new variety of E. Emoryi from the islands of Lower California, having twisted yellow spines, handsomer than E. Grusoni. Flowers, satiny-orange, sometimes with broad crimson mid-vein.

- Echinocactus Emoryi, var. (No. 201), from Lower California -Dark crimson flowers; \$100.00 per 100.
- Echinocactus McDowellii, Rébut-Mammillaria-like, thickly set with long, straight, yellowish-white spines, from among which the mauve-pink blossoms hardly push out ; \$60.00 per 100.
- Echinocactus polycephalus-We have some fine clusters about 30 cm. in diam. \$3.00 to \$5.00 each.
- Echinocactus Trollieti, Rébut. (No. 79)-Egg-shaped, very symmetrical, with dark spines lying close to the body. Flowers chocolate and yellow; \$2.00 each.
- Mammillaria Goodridgii monstrosa-A beautiful symmetrical specimen 10 cm. across; price \$10.00.
- Mammillaria Halei, Coulter-Cereus-like, with straight, long, stiff, purplish-brown spines, scarlet flower and large red fruit. From the islands of Lower California. Makes fine clusters. Good plants 8-15 cm. high, \$100.00 per 100.
- Mammillaria radiosa Alversonii, Coulter-A fine upright grower, after the style of M. Arizonica, but far finer, and a native of the Californian desert; \$50.00 per 100.
- Pilocereus Sargentianus, Orcutt-When young bare, with small bunches of star-shaped spines along the 5 or 6 ribs, resembling the appearance of C. gemmatus; when older covered with soft, white bristles, 3-6 cm. long along the ridges of the clear-cut ribs. Body, a clear, pale green. Flowers pink, profuse along the ribs and half way down the plant.
